# Industrial Action by the National Education Union (NEU), Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March

As you are aware the **National Education Union** (NEU) will be taking further industrial action on **Wednesday 15**<sup>th</sup> **and Thursday 16**<sup>th</sup> **March**, in response to the ongoing challenges facing our education system - please see the attached NEU leaflet for further information.

I now write to confirm that I expect a significant number of NEU members at Beaminster School to be taking strike action. Therefore, due to the number of staff involved, we will have to adapt our teaching for both these days.

- 1. Years 11, 12 and 13 should attend school as normal on both days. School transport will be running as normal. Year 11 students will continue with their March examinations. 6<sup>th</sup> Form students will undertake their normal timetable with their usual teachers, or be set self-guided study tasks, revision and online learning should their normal teacher not be present.
- 2. Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 will NOT be able to routinely come into school. This is due to the reduced number of staff present so these year groups will work remotely from home. Non-striking staff will set work and a variety of tasks for their lessons via ClassCharts. If students have an NEU teacher who is striking, then no directed work will be set for that lesson. Instead, students should use the time to complete homework, read, undertake Bedrock tasks or do self-study linked to the most recent lesson. The use of Seneca, MyMaths and BBC Bitesize are just three of the excellent resources that students should be accessing regularly.
- 3. Wednesday and Thursday remain a **normal working school day for all students** and we expect them all to undertake the work that has been set for them.
- 4. We are aware that a small number of students are struggling to complete their studies at home and require a more formal place to work. Therefore, we will be providing supervised study, in school, for those who cannot complete their learning at home; for Years 9 and 10 (only) this will be offered on Wednesday, and for Years 7 and 8 (only) it will be Thursday. Should you feel your child requires such support please complete the relevant year group form on the links below today so we are aware of the number of students involved. (NB: the form only needs to be completed if you wish your child to come into school on the designated day).

5. We will ensure that all parents/carers of students in **Years 7 to 10** who have **Free School Meals** receive an online supermarket voucher, in advance of these days, to cover the cost of their normal lunch.
