Dear Parents and Carers.

It is always very reassuring to receive positive comments about our students and this week has been particularly fulsome.

Firstly, our **School Improvement Partner** undertook 3 days of lesson visits and interviews across Years 7 to 11 and wanted to pass on how impressed he was with the school culture at Beaminster, driven by care and kindness. The vaccination team were delighted by your response to the **flu Immunisations**, with nearly 300 students going through on Thursday morning, and said what a helpful and polite group of students they were.

Thanks to the ongoing support of **Brit Valley Rotary Club** all of our Year 10s have had the opportunity to experience a formal interview and to get positive feedback on how to complete a CV and present themselves in the best way possible. We are extremely grateful for the time commitment and support of Brit Valley Rotary and also for their kind comments about our students, and for the support that our Sixth Form provided.

Finally, as part of our ongoing **safeguarding procedures**, we held a practice lockdown drill to ensure that we can provide a safe space for all students in an emergency. The students were very mature and calm in their response, enabling us to secure the site and identify a couple of issues that we can improve upon.
