Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to the summer term and a very busy first week.

At the end of the Easter break, 46 students and 5 staff travelled up to Manchester to attend the **Manchester City vs Leicester City** football match. This was a wonderful experience for all, where students visited the National Football Museum to absorb the great culture of the game, as well as to watch some fantastic football, including two goals from the imperious Erling Haaland! I'm sure there were many tired students on the Sunday as they didn't arrive back at school until 2.15am, but they were all a real credit to the school, some photos of the day can be viewed on the school Facebook page.

Tuesday saw a group of our Year 10 Triple Science students visit the construction site of the **Hinkley Point** Nuclear Power Station. As well as "Big Carl" the biggest crane in the world standing at 250m, the students had a tour of the huge site and learnt a lot more about the fission and fusion process that drives nuclear energy.

Also on Tuesday, the Year 9 **Duke of Edinburgh** (DoE) students continued their expedition training with a First Aid course, followed by Health and Safety, and a last opportunity to practise putting up their tents! There are four demanding sections to DoE that involve helping the community/environment, becoming fitter, developing new skills, and planning and training for completing an expedition. With over 40 Bronze students going out this weekend, and a further team undertaking their Silver expedition, I am very grateful to the large number of staff who help to make all this possible for our students.

Year 7 were busy with two sporting fixtures this week. In **Basketball**, against Atlantic Academy, they showed a high level of skill and quality, winning confidently 30-12, even though Atlantic brought on some older students in the second half to provide a more challenging fixture. In **Football**, the boys produced a very polished performance to beat All Saints 6-1 and show that they have come a long way this year.

The **Primary cricket festival** at Beaminster Cricket Club, on Tuesday, was a very positive way to start the season. With so many matches to fit in we were delighted that Year 9 students, Addison Gunning, Beau Wild and Ed House, were there to officiate.

A big thank you to Craig Sorrell for all the wonderful work he does with the **Bridport Evolution Basketball** team and to Andy David for the **Beaminster Football** team, which both run on Friday evenings, and Ross Baker for his support at **Beaminster Cricket Club**.
