Dear Parents and Carers.

Although the worst of the winter bite was north of the Beaminster Tunnel, we do appreciate that recent weather problems, bus diversions and a number of cancellations have all made for a tricky past few weeks. A reminder that bus users should always check the Dorset Travel and/or First Bus sites for information.

Additionally, as the government are not yet willing to speak with the National Education Union, the likelihood of the **2 day strike going ahead on Wednesday and Thursday next week** is increased. It is important that we continue to support our examination classes, so Years 11, 12 and 13 will be in school on both days, with Year 11 sitting their final trial examinations. However, we do recognise that some students are struggling to study and complete work at home. Therefore, we will be offering supervised study to those that really do require a quiet learning environment - for Years 9 and 10 on Wednesday, and Years 7 and 8 on Thursday. An electronic form for this will go out on Monday, to be returned by Tuesday lunchtime, if the industrial action is still planned.

Despite the cold weather on Wednesday, it was a real pleasure to welcome so many parents, carers and students to our **Year 9 into 10 Curriculum Evening**. The opportunity to speak with staff and to see the quality of work our current students are producing was very much appreciated, as was the overview of the process provided by Mr Barnes. Initial surveys will be sent out on Microsoft Forms next week.

On the sporting front, with the team missing some key players and playing on a huge pitch, Year 8 had a tough Area Football match against Wey Valley, and after battling hard, they eventually went down 6-1. In Hockey, our snow-depleted, mainly Year 10 team narrowly lost 2-0 to a strong, mainly Year 11 Colfox side, including a number of boys, who were using this opportunity for their GCSE assessment. Despite this, the team played well and really enjoyed the challenge, and were unlucky not to get a goal. Year 7 and 9 were also due to play at Colfox yesterday, but a downpour on the drive over flooded the astroturf making it unplayable. All was not lost, however, with some drills and mini-games organised in the Sports Hall so students did at least get to play, and the planned fixture is being rearranged.

Mr Crossland and the **Leonardo's Flying Start engineering team** of 16 students had an invigorating day at RNAS Yeovilton Air Museum yesterday, competing in the South West Finals. They undertook a range of knowledge quizzes, career talks, tours and flight engineering challenges, where they built the tallest tower, and flew the gliders that they had constructed in school against 34 other teams. Letters for the forthcoming **Stop the Clock** day on Wednesday 22nd March have all gone out, please ensure that **student planners are signed** and all payments made as required by **Friday 17th March**.

We are all aware that **good punctuality and attendance** at school are essential for high levels of learning to take place, and for students to gain their best GCSE grades. Research shows that, on average, students with less than 90% attendance attain one grade less than their peers. Therefore, the government are asking all schools to ensure that families <u>are made aware</u> if their child's attendance drops below 95% each half-term. We very much appreciate that while there may be compelling reasons for attendance to dip, and that bus cancellations are very frustrating, we are obligated to share this information with you and do genuinely want to work with you if we can help to improve your child's attendance. Please do speak to your child's Tutor if we can help in any way.
