Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the Summer term and I do hope that you all enjoyed a restful Easter break.

On the last day of Spring term our Year 8 Flying Start Challenge teams were competing at the Royal Naval Air Station in Yeovilton. After a superb day, with ten schools and almost forty teams, all four of our teams finished in the top ten so all will now go forward to the national finals in Bristol at the end of this half-term! Congratulations to them all.

Whilst Year 12 expel a huge sigh of relief after completing their examination week, we have now moved into the start of formal examinations season. Tuesday saw a very busy day of GCSE PE moderation with an external examiner analysing students' skills, techniques and performances in Football, Netball and Badminton. This is followed by A Level Photography and GCSE Art exams next week and then French Orals the following week.

Also, on Tuesday, the Year 9 Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) students continued their expedition training with a very hands-on, practical, First Aid course, followed by Health and Safety. There are four demanding sections to DofE that involve helping the community / environment, becoming fitter, developing new skills, and planning and training for completing an expedition. The skills, knowledge and experiences that they gain are so important in helping to develop their independence and confidence as they move into Key Stage 4. We wish them well in their final expedition next weekend.

This was an opportunity to celebrate the many young people who are engaged in various projects and activities and who are dedicating their time to support others and make Beaminster a better place. On the sporting front we were treated to two great games of football last night.
