

Dear Parents and Carers

At this time of year there are always lots of tips to beat the January blues, so I would wholeheartedly recommend a few of our own!

Secondly, do make some time to drop into Sou' Sou' West Gallery in Symondsbury to see our **Spring Art Exhibition** which runs until Sunday 25th January. The wonderful work on display covers a range of media, from across the year groups, and we are delighted with the art that our young people have made (poster attached).

Thirdly, with less than a week to go, students are working hard with final rehearsals on Sunday and Monday before the dress performance of '**Chariots of Fire**' on Tuesday afternoon in front of Year 7, Beaminster St Mary's Primary and Mountjoy pupils. There are only a few tickets still available on ParentMail for the performances on either Thursday January 29th or Friday January 30th, adults £6, student/child £4, so do book quickly! The cast and crew have been magnificent throughout and we wish them all well next week.

Additionally, the benefits of getting outside with friends, despite the weather, was encapsulated by our **Year 7 Girls Football team** in their County Cup Match against Lytchett Minster. Despite peppering the goal throughout, and the Lytchett players frequently looking on in awe, our girls just could not get the ball in the net and were 2–0 down at half-time. However, Naomi Knight orchestrated a more clinical approach to see Beaminster quickly equalise, and Poppy Wrixon kept the opposition forwards at bay. As shot after shot at the Lytchett goal was saved extra-time looked certain, but in the final kick of the match a volley from a Lytchett corner went in to give them a 3–2 win. However, a KFC refuel and some enthusiastic singing all the way home soon lifted all of our team's spirits!
